

Medications and Personal Items Traveling Offshore



- All prescriptions, over the counter medications, herbal and dietary supplements, and personal hygiene items must be in their original labelled containers for proper identification when traveling offshore.
- Do not bring more than one extra week's prescription medication on an offshore rotation.
- Individuals bringing prescribed medication that is on the prohibited list will be referred to BP Occupational Health by Heliport officials and will be ineligible to fly until cleared.
- Do not carry medication prescribed to others. You will be subject to a drug screen and the medication will not be allowed offshore.
- Outdated / expired prescription medications (over 1 year old) are not allowed offshore. This does not apply to over the counter or personal hygiene items.
- Medications with possible side effects that may affect fitness for duty (dizziness, drowsiness, confusion, etc.) must be reported to the medic offshore.
- All medicines being mailed to offshore will be screened by heliport personnel at the heliport and delivered to the medic.
- Medications that are illegal in the US but legal in the country where they were prescribed will not be allowed offshore. Medications will be confiscated and disposed of by security and you will be subject to a drug screen.
