

Access to Employee Exposure and Medical Records



January 5, 2021

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires BP to inform you of your right to examine and copy any medical and/or exposure records relating to your employment.

If you participate in medical or exposure monitoring, you may request these records.

Your employee medical records may include the following:

- A. Medical and employment questionnaires or histories.
- B. Results of medical examinations and laboratory tests.
- C. Medical opinions, diagnoses, progress notes, and recommendations.
- D. First-aid records.

Employee exposure records may include the following:

- A. Monitoring results of your workplace air or measurements of toxic substances or harmful physical agents in the workplace.
- B. Safety data sheets (SDSs) containing information about a substance's hazards to human health.

Employee medical and exposure records are maintained by the Gulf of Mexico Health and Industrial Hygiene Team and are available to you or your designated representative upon request. Contractors may contact their contractor representative for these records.
